PORTLAND, June 2.—Poultry was in heavy supply and in the clean-up yesterday as low as 11 cents was named by dealers as best. Young ducks are also coming in very freely and price has dropped off.

Butter and Eggs. Among produce dealers the advance of city creamery to 2 1/2 cents was made by the house announcing the rise on account of the increased manufacture of ice cream.

Other grades of butter, so far, have not been affected by the advance, and there are no indications that they will be very soon. Store butter is in very heavy receipt and country creamery also comes in in excess of requirements.

Eggs at 19 to 19 1/2 cents find quite an active demand and receipts, while heavy, are not top heavy. The 20-cent quotation was not mentioned this morning as obtained in any instance.

Poultry. The tone of the poultry market is decidedly weak. Nearly every dealer talks lower prices, and the prospect is for continued full receipts. No change in quotations is noted this morning, but another day may bring lower figures.

Eggs. Eggs are steady at quotations, 19@20c, with most sales reported at 19 1/2c.
