PORTLAND, June 8.—A somewhat what firmer market is noticeable for good store butter. In the leading houses the claim is made that 12 1/2 is top, considering the large stocks on hand and bulky arrivals, while in other no less prominent places the quotation is up to 14c. with the advance justified on outside demand for repacked goods.

One great obstacle in the way of handling country shipments to the best advantage is the lack of care in boxing the product. Some lots come in packed in all sorts of shapes and encased in inferior boxes. This butter in order to meet requirements of outside markets must be repacked in as near uniform size as possible, and boxed in new, clean cases. As a consequence country dealers do not get the benefit of top quotations, as the cost of repacking and cases must be covered.

Eggs continue firm at 18 1/2 cents as a fair average price for best grade. There are more and more small sales at 20c mentioned, but as a general rule the 18 1/2 is knocked off on medium to large orders.
