PORTLAND, June 11.—There is every prospect for the coming Oregon potato movement to be a much heavier than for years past, if not a record-breaker.

In the first place, the season is not too far advanced for a good increase in acreage, which on top of that now rapidly maturing will make the crops if anything quite up to last year's heavy production.

Reports from California are not favorable to a normal crop, even if planting should continue for a month or two yet. Now it happens that the Alaska freight rate has been placed at the 7c figure for cargo direct, as against local to ground and reshipment. This will attract Alaska buyers, and as they will not be able to have full orders filled in San Francisco, Portland stands the best chance for securing that trade.

Dairy Products.

The advance to 24c for city creamery butter became fairly well established for the product of one of the large creameries, though the advance was not followed generally. There was a very good demand for country goods from outside markets, and nearly all offerings were disposed of to those places, while less went into cold storage than the week before, according to the best information obtainable.

Eggs became much stronger toward the close of the week, and in some quarters the price was quoted up to 21c 1/2. The ruling quotation, however, is 19 1/2@20c, most sales being made at top figure. The Alaska demand continues, and as that trade takes the highest class in almost every kind of products and staples, the coast feels the effect.
