An officer of the Congressional library was recently remarking upon the difference of the binding put upon the documents issued by the United States government and those of European countries. "Here, for instance, is a volume issued by the French government upon fish culture," he said. "You will observe that the paper, presswork and illustrations are the finest, while the binding, or cover, rather, is a very cheap paper. A volume somewhat simllar is the annual report of the Smithsonian institution in this country, but upon this report is put a good binding of green cloth. The reason for this is simple. Practically every book collector or institution in Europe has its private binding, it being possible to have this work done at a very moderate rate, and the paper covers are intended merely as wrappers until the volume shall have reached its destination. In this country there are a few individuals and some libraries which have their books bound in a private binding, but the cost of such work is so great that it is far from being usual. This is one reason for the fact that the paper and presswork of a French book. for instance, are so much finer than those of an American book of the same price."-Harper's Weekly.




