

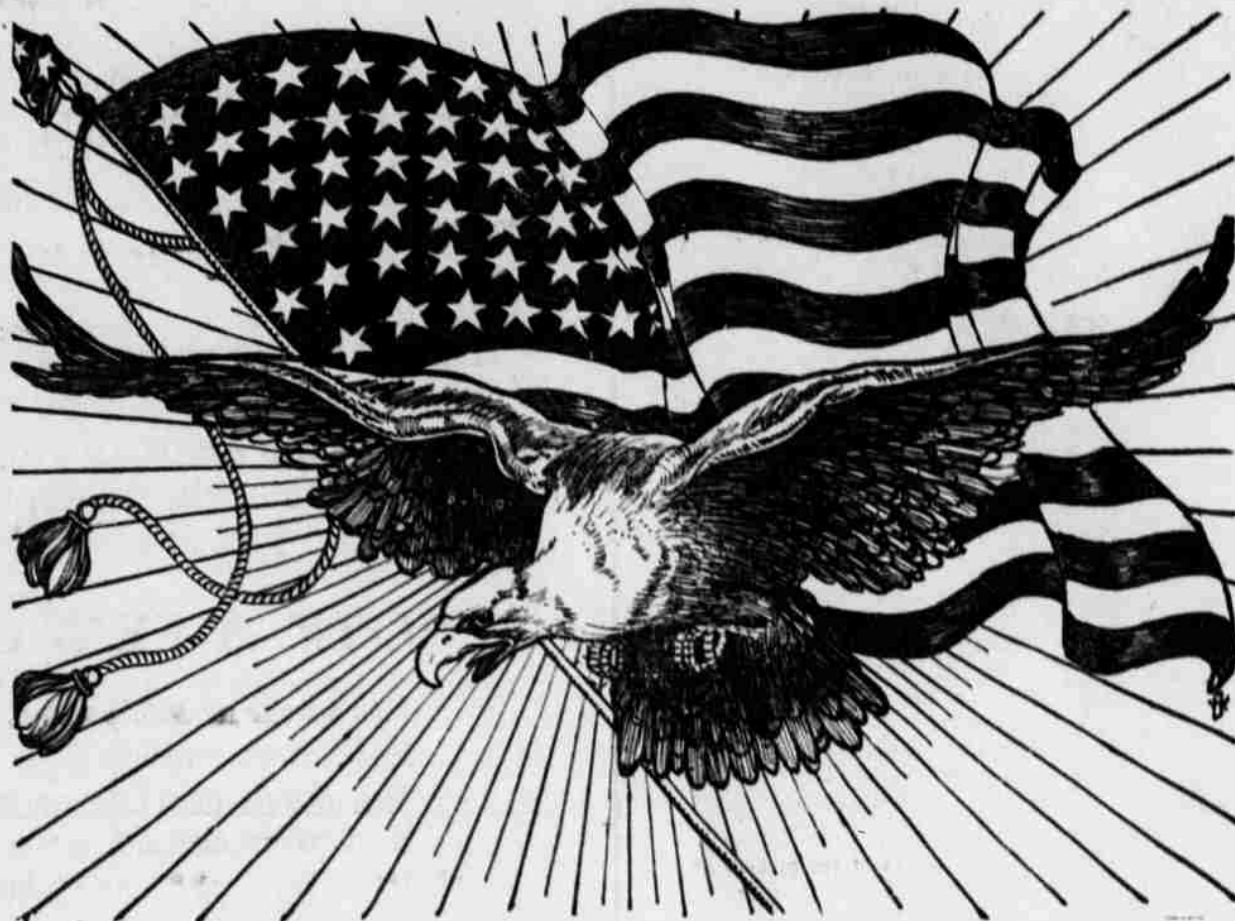

My beloved brethren:

THE COUNTY COURT

Complete Record of the Transactions of That Body.

MUCH BUSINESS IS FINISHED

County Court Meets in Regular Monthly Session and Disposes of Large Grist—Many Bills Are Allowed—Items.

The following is the authorized resume of the official acts of the county court of Clatsop county, Oregon, had, and done at the June, 1906, term of that body, to-wit:

In the matter of the claim in full of Messrs. Hastie and Dongan against Clatsop county for material used and employed in construction of the new court house structure and labor performed thereon.

In the matter of improving county road No. 77, near Columbia county line:

This being the time set, the following bids for clearing and grading were opened and read: Thomas F. Johnson, \$1.50 per rod; Andrew Johnston and James A. Elliott, \$1.15 per rod; J. F. Johnston, \$1.20 per rod. A. Johnston and J. A. Elliott, being the lowest bidder it is ordered that the contract be awarded them.

In the matter of clearing right of way on road No. 77 from Olney School House to 16-mile post where it connects with the present road:

This being the time the following bids were opened and read. J. C. Dunkin, to furnish all material and labor and clear right of way in accordance with plans and specifications and notice for bids, 80 cents per rod or \$256 per mile.

Gus Gronnel, will clear right of way from Olney school house to 16-mile post for 93 cents per rod.

Fred Normand will clear right of way according to notice for \$1 per rod or \$320 per mile.

F. M. Blaisdell will clear according to notice for bids for \$1 per rod.

Henry A. Guillaume, clear right of way, first half mile, \$1.65; second half mile, \$3.30; second mile, \$2.95.

Charles Guillaume, to clear first two miles, first mile, \$1.75 per rod; second half, \$3.35 per rod; second mile, \$3 per rod.

S. Glaser to clear between 12 and 14 mile stake at \$3 per rod. The court after reading the above bids and being satisfied that the bid of J. C. Dunkin is the lowest. It is ordered that the letting of the contract be postponed until the route can again be examined, is received by the court.

In the matter of clearing right of way on road No. 74:

The clerk is directed and ordered to ask for bids.

In the matter of clearing right of way on road No. 100:

The court having examined the bid of W. A. Goodin and being of the opinion that the notice for bids is not sufficient: Ordered that said bid be rejected and the clerk ordered to ask for bids.

In the matter of the public wharf of Svensen:

Ordered that the clerk notify the supervisor that the warehouse is old and rotten and dangerous and to remove same by tearing it down.

Ordered that the report of Miss Emma C. Warren on account of the educational exhibit at the Lewis & Clark Fair be filed.

In the matter of the new court house:

The court having purchased about two-thirds of the material to build the new court house will secure figure showing the amount it will cost to finish the same, when the figures and the legal opinion have been obtained an invitation will be extended the taxpayers to meet with the County Court and discuss the matter.

In the matter of Ralph Sloop for a county road:

Ordered that the clerk send notice to petitioner and remonstrators that this matter will be taken up on July 7, 1906, when some action will be taken in the matter.

In the matter of county warrants over seven years old:

The clerk having certified to the court a list of county warrants more than 7 years old as per section 2632 of Beltinger & Cotton's Code. Ordered that the list be published for one week including one issue of the weekly stating if warrants are not presented for payment within 60 days same will be cancelled.

JUNE 18, 1906.

In the matter of clearing of right of way on county road No. 77 from the Olney School house to the 16-mile post:

The court now takes up the matter of the bids heretofore submitted and the bills of J. C. Dunkin of 80 cents per rod or \$256 per mile is considered by the court to be a very reasonable bid.

It is therefore ordered by the court that the contract be awarded to J. C. Dunkin at the price stated in his bid.

In the matter of clearing right of way on road No. 74:

Bids having been asked for clearing right of way on road No. 74 and no bids having been filed and Mr. M. S. Jensen now appearing in court and agree-
