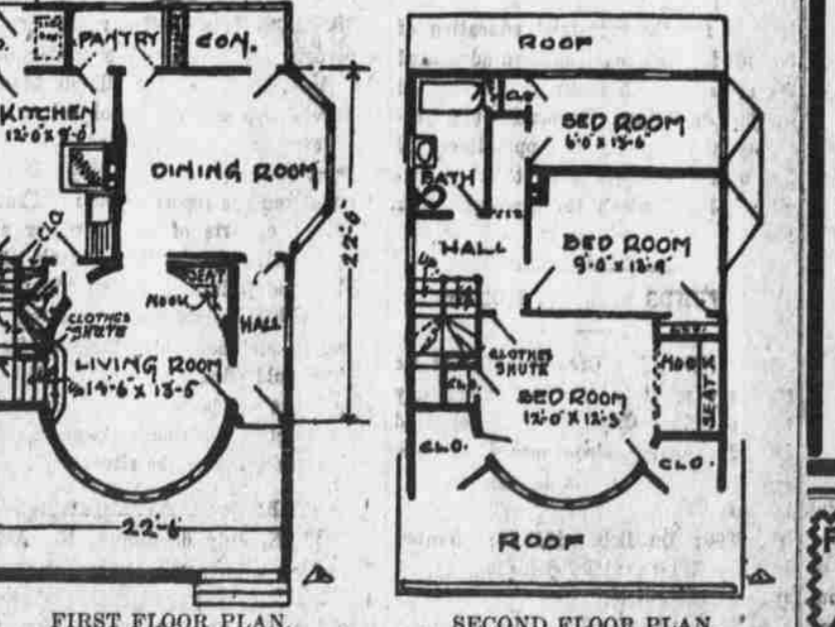
CONVENIENT LITTLE COTTAGE
