Eggs and Butter.

There continues to be a very good market for all concerned, in the egg market, prices being firm at 22c, which is considered reasonable to buyer and satisfactory to seller. In some quarters a half cent is named on top of the generally accepted figure. Ranch eggs are not coming in sufficiently to meet requirements, but the light receipts are being augmented by the Eastern goods, that sell side by side with the local eggs. No Portland storage eggs are being withdrawn, as far as could be learned.




