Eggs and Butter.

There continues to be a very good market for all concorned, in the egg market, prices being firm at 22c, which is considered reasonable to buyer and satisfactory to seller. In some quarters a half cent is named on top of the generally accepted figure. Ranch eggs are quirements, but the light receipts are being augmented by the Eastern goods, that sell side by side with the local eggs. No Portland storage eggs are being withdrawn, as far as could be learned.

Butter is firmer, though there are still very heavy receipts from usual sources of supply, and some from quarters news to this trade previous to this year.
