			<p>NOTICE TO IMPROVE.</p> <p>BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON Council of the City of Astoria: That said Council hereby declares its determination and intention to improve Exchange street from the west line of 9th street to a point eight feet west of the east line of 8th street. Said improvement shall be made by grading said street to the established grade to the full width thereof, constructing cement side walks on both sides thereof with corners on 8th street and with all necessary drainage. The side walk shall be six feet wide with a two foot park space between the curb and the edge of the side walk, and from curb to curb the street shall be graded nine inches below the sub grade with a sufficient crown in the center and filled in and macadamized with crushed rock to the depth of nine inches when thoroughly rolled and gutters shall be constructed</p>
