How to Grow Alfalfa.

Alfalfa must be reset every third year. I have been using cutaway harrows for resetting it along the Pacific coast for a great many years. The best method of resetting is to sow about ten pounds of new seed to the acre; then go over it with the cutaway harrow, set at a light angle, in both directions, split the heads of the old plants and reset with the new seed. By this means the crop can be produced continuously for a long term of years.—G. M. Clarke in Country Gentleman.

Oiling a Separator.

In the mechanical operation of a separator none but the best oil should be used, and this should not be allowed to gum or become dirty on the bearings. It is good practice to flush the bearings with kerosene occasionally by making a run with kerosene in the oil cups. This will serve to cut out any gum or dust that has accumulated in the bearings and will make the machine run much faster and easier.
