There are heavy receipts of Rogue River watermelons that are selling well at 756:\$1.00 per cwt., and are giving good satisfaction to the trade. Canteloupes are not in very good shape, some off grades moving at buyers' figures, Quotation for good canteloupes is near \$1 one way or the other.

Tomatoes are still in pretty heavy receipt and the price has dropped to about 25e a box.

Onions are weaker on good supplies crop is quite up to former years Today's price is \$125 to \$1.50 per sack.

The egg market continues quite strong and while 25 cents is quoted by most leading commission houses, there are here and there to be found firms that name 25@26c for first-class candled goods. Receipts were somewhat better this morning, but the market is by no means oversupplied. Poultry remains steady with very good receipts, though a healthy demand keeps the stocks from accumulating.

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
