PORTLAND, Sept. 24.—Local stocks of potatoes are somewhat better than were expected at the beginning of last week. It was then thought that farmers would continue to be slow in getting the product into market, but reports going out that a better price was in sight had the effect of starting a movement in this direction. County price is firmly held at 75¢ to 85¢ for ordinary run and 90¢ to \$1 for choice.
