IMPORTANT SESSION OF ASTORIA HALL LAST/EVENING-SOME PER- the following: TINENT CHANGES CONSIDERED.

Twelve of the nineteen members of the Astoria Charter commission met at the regular session of the commission last night in the council chamber at the city hall, to-wit: Mayor Herman Wise, Judge F. J. Taylor, Dr. W. C. Logan. Councilman C. A. Leinenweber, H. M. Lorntsen and John Nylund,

The present status of the work was thoroughly discussed by those in attendance and the conclusion was reached that there was no time to lose in perfecting the changes and amendments that are to be submitted to the people for approval at the coming city election on December 12 next, and a tacit agreement to expedite the work.

Among the new elements of municipal law injected into the deliberations last night, were the following, submitted by Mr. Lorntsen:

Granting to the city the power and authority to construct and purchase water works and electric lighting plants and to issue bonds therefore, etc.

Abolishing the police commission and investing the power of appointment and organization of the police force, in the hands of the mayor and common council, etc.
