PORTLAND, Oct. 3.—Poultry prices have dropped off, as was confidently expected by the trade for the past few days. It now requires mighty good chickens to bring 14 cents and dealers report the market as weak, even at the reduction noted.

Supplies are somewhat above the requirements, but at the same time dealers are not carrying a great amount over from day to day.

Eggs continue strong and receipts are gradually dropping off. First-class ranch eggs sell readily at 30c, and the generally expressed opinion on Front street is that higher quotations are in sight.

The butter situation is slightly mixed as to city creamery values.

Price lists were sent out today by one of the big concerns at the old figure, which would indicate that the matter of advancing the price is still in abeyance. Country creameries are quoted slightly higher, though the market is not particularly strong, and there is no certainty that the advance can be maintained.
