PORTLAND, Oct. 15.—There was little trade in any line along Front street this morning. Fruit stocks with the exception of bananas and apples, were quite low, but as buyers were scarce, dealers regarded conditions as favorable.

Some melons remain in storage to supply an irregular demand and there are also peaches and pears sufficient to fill orders to some extent.

Grapes from the South are expected this afternoon, but as the weather in near-by growing sections is not favorable to pickers, but few are coming in.

Ground cherries are in fairly full supply with sales in a small way.

Seasonable vegetables are plentiful, cabbage being in oversupply.
