**PORLTAND.** Oct. 25.—There continues to be a good market for potatoes, and dealers are offering a cent a pound for strictly choice varieties. The potato crop in Oregon will be somewhat lighter than last year, and the demand is increasing. Eastern eggs are being shipped in, but country eggs meet with a strong demand and ready sale. An increase in the price of butter is noticed. Portland depends mostly upon local vegetable gardens for produce in that line.
