The present commission shall hold office untill the first Monday in Janu-ary, 1999, and until their successors shall have been elected and have qualified and at the general election to be held on the second Wednesday of December, 1908 a commission consis-ting of nine members shall be elected from each ward, and one at large, one member from each ward shall be elec-ted for the term of four years, and one from each ward for the term of eight years and the commissioner at large shall be elected for the term of eight years, and the successors of each eight years, and the successors of each shall be elected for the full term of eight years, so that one member of the water commission from each ward shall be elected every four years, and and the term of office shall be eight years and until their successors are elected and have qualified, and any person armointed to fill a vacancy shall hold for the remainder of the unexpired term.
