

## MONTANA ELECTION

Republicans Will Have Majority on Joint Ballot.

SUCCESSOR TO SENATOR CLARK

Surprises of Tuesday's Elections for Both Democrats and Republicans, Showing Politics Eliminated From the Campaign.

HELENA, Mont., Nov. 8.—Reports from every county in the state indicate that the legislature which will elect a senator to succeed Senator Clark will consist of 57 republicans and 43 democrats, giving the republicans a majority of 13 on joint ballot.

The latest figures on the state ticket do not make any change in the estimate giving Gray, republican, 5,000 plurality for congressman.

While the count in Silver Bow has not been completed, the returns so far indicate that Walsh, democrat, will carry it by less than 1,000, whereas it was expected that he would have not less than 5,000.

There have been some surprises for the republicans, also, some counties that have been depended on to send republicans to the legislature sending democrats. In Lewis and Clark county which has not gone republican for years, the democrats lost everything except a justice and constable.

### LEVIED ASSESSMENT.

Firemen's Fund Will Pay San Francisco Losses.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 8.—The directors of the Firemen's Fund Insurance company voted today to levy an assessment of \$300 a share upon the stock of the company and to authorize the financing of the holdings of the company so that a final installment of 30 cents may be paid soon. An installment of 20 per cent has been paid already.

A report was submitted to the effect that the claimants representing practically 90 per cent of the San Francisco conflagration losses have approved the proposed plan of settlement and rehabilitation of the company.

### CANCER CAN BE CURED.

If Disease is Detected in Early Stages It Can Be Cured.

CHICAGO, Nov. 8.—Cancer is far from incurable, according to Dr. Nicholas Senn, in a lecture on the "Problem of Cancer" at the University of Chicago yesterday. Dr. Senn declared that fifty per cent of the cases of cancer which are brought to the attention of physicians in the earliest stages may be cured. In the course of his lecture, Dr. Senn advocated the establishment of some sort of bureau to keep the public informed as to the nature and to the possible cures of cancer, as is done in Europe. Many victims of cancer prevent cures by becoming despondent and keeping away from good physicians, he said. If the disease is detected in its early stages, a cure may be effected, said Dr. Senn. "But if it is allowed to go to an advanced stage, nothing can be done."

### USUAL OCCURRENCE.

CHICAGO, Nov. 8.—Jealousy over the rejections of a man's attentions, is believed by the police to have been the cause of a murder and suicide in Lincoln Park last night. Hearing two shots the police made a search and discovered the dead body of a young man and near him a woman unconscious and dying. She lived one hour. The woman is believed to be Mary Olsen and the man F. C. Gray. The police state that the woman made a desperate struggle. When found, her waist was torn almost off, her hat some distance away and her hair disordered. Both shots were in the temple. The man still grasped the revolver.

### COUNTY SEAT FIGHT.

CASTLE ROCK, Wash., Nov. 8.—Returns so far indicate that Kalama has held the county seat for which Castle Rock and Kelso were bidding and that a mixed ticket has been elected in Cowlitz county.

### GIRLS ARE RESCUED.

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 8.—Firemen rescued 29 terrified girl employes of Andrew Dobbie, a dry goods merchant, from the third floor of his store during a blaze there early today. A few were slightly injured.

### TWO GIRLS DEAD.

Two Domestic Employed in German Hospital Commit Suicide.

CHICAGO, Nov. 8.—A quarrel between a girl and her lover, according to statements of the police, is responsible for the death of Anna Hirber and Rosa Stupka, two domestics employed in the German hospital. The two dead girls together with Aloisia Moyol, and another domestic, occupied the same room. This morning when the at-

tendants broke into the room they found two of them dead and two unconscious. From a letter found among the Moyol girl's effects, addressed to John Chamazoo, it is believed that she was brooding over a disappointment in a love affair, arose in the night and turned on the gas in an effort to take her life, but was unsuccessful. Chamazoo was taken into custody pending the coroner's inquest. The Moyol girl and another girl are in a precarious condition.

### SECRET SERVICE AGENT.

Mr. Caldwell Found Dead Alongside of Railroad Track.

ALBUQUERQUE, Nov. 8.—Government Secret Service Agent Caldwell was found alongside the railroad track dead at Algodone, twenty miles from here today. His skull was badly fractured and arm broken. Whether he was the victim of an accident or foul play has not yet been determined.
