

RAILROAD RATE LAW

Interstate Commerce Commission Besieged With Questions.

FAVOR FEDERAL OWNERSHIP

Commission Believes Government Ownership Will Retard Rather Than Assist the Progress of the Country.

CHICAGO, Nov. 14.—A dispatch to the Tribune from Washington says:

Learnedly as Congress discussed the new railroad rate law, it used language in the statute capable of so many different interpretations that the Interstate Commerce Commission is almost swamped by the deluge of questions pouring in upon it daily.

Because government economists are firmly convinced that government ownership will retard rather than assist the progress of the country they are impressing upon the commission the necessity of wise interpretation of various provisions of the railroad rate law.

The commission is giving the various questions which have arisen its most careful consideration, but there is no doubt the carriers will appeal the most important to the courts.
