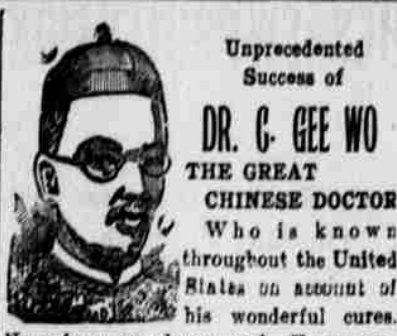
Flowers and Weeds. You say it's quite provoking In such a house as ours That I won't give up smoking And spend the cash on flowers.
