

LAW TO BE TESTED

Department of Justice in California Introduced to Proceed.

JAPANESE IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Effort to be Made to Create Separate Schools for Japanese and Chinese in San Francisco, if Decision is Favorable.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 5.—Under direct orders from Washington, the representatives of the Department of Justice in California have been instructed to begin an action in the courts and test the legality of the state statute which provides that the children of Mongolian descent shall attend a separate school.

President Altman of the Board of Education, yesterday received a communication from United States Attorney Bevin, requesting a conference, that arrangements might be made to institute a suit. This conference will be held at the rooms of the board this afternoon, when the parties at interest will agree as to the procedure.

When the attention of President Altman of the Board of Education was called to that portion of the President's message made public yesterday, he said that the utterances of President Roosevelt on the Japanese question would have no effect on the action of the board.

"We have simply put into effect a law which was passed by the law-making body of this state," said he. "Individually and collectively each and every member of the board believes it is a good law. We will not recede from the position which we have taken, and believe that our action will be sustained by public sentiment throughout the state, even if the courts should declare it to be unconstitutional or a violation of treaty rights."

MACHINE WORKERS.

New Scheme Being Devised for Assistance of Mechanics.

NEW YORK, Dec. 5.—Frederick W. Taylor, president of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers at the opening of the annual meeting last night, announced the results of 26 years of experience which he believes will do much toward increasing the workmen in various lines of industrial activity.

The experiments were undertaken to obtain a part of the information necessary to establish in a machine shop a system of management, the central ideas of which are to give to each workman a definite task, and an exact time allowance for each element of the work, to pay high wages to those who perform their tasks in the allotted time and ordinary wages to those who take more than their time allowance.

The experiments of Mr. Taylor have been conducted in the works of the Midvale Steel Company, the Bethlehem Steel Company and other large concerns.

The work of Mr. Taylor and his associates was to bring the elements of machine shop practice into the domain of exact science. Their experiments cost about \$200,000, but, it was stated that they have found laws covering the important elements of the "art" and have obtained mathematical formulas which express these laws. They developed a slide rule by means of which the ordinary mechanic can double the output of a machine previously run by a first-class mechanic using his own judgment.

In some investigations into other lines of industry, such as textiles and other light manufacturers, it was found that the task for a man after proper investigation, was vastly greater than any he could or would set for himself.

JAPS ARE PLEASSED.

President's Message on San Francisco School Question.

TOKIO, Dec. 5.—The clear, firm and determined attitude of President Roosevelt in his message in reference to the San Francisco school question and anti-Japanese sentiment is warmly praised. It is felt here, however, that as much as the San Francisco authorities may be affected by the local sentiment, they can ultimately only yield to the moral weight which President Roosevelt's message carries.
