INCREASING FACILITIES.

Atchinson, Topeka and Santa Fe will Increase Equipments.

CHICAGO, Dec. 8 .- The tribune today says:

The Atchinson Topeka & Santa Fe Rallway is making preparations for large expenditures in 1907 for extensive improvements all along its system. Its budget for the year has not been finally made up yet, but its outlays for double tracking, extension, new equipment, etc., probably will aggregate not less than \$25,0000,000. One of the most important pieces of work the road now has under way, the double tracking of its main line from Chicago to Kansas City, will be pushed rapidly, although it is doubtful if it will be completed before some time in 1908. Another large improvement is the construction of a new line from Mexico, New Mexico, to Brownsville Tex. It is said that when this line is built Santa Fe will have the shortest route between San Francisco and Galveston.

The Santa Fe has placed orders for equipment which raises its outstanding orders to \$9 000,000. It is also proposed to reduce much of the roadbed, and to extend the block signal service.
