

OFFICIAL COURT PROCEEDINGS

For the Month of December, 1906, of The County Court, Clatsop Coun-

The following claims were filed against the County, examined and ordered paid by warrants on the various fund:

Table listing various fund amounts: General Fund, Road District No. 2, Road District No. 3, etc.

Total amount of bills allowed \$5718.29 Total amount of bills continued \$1.00

Total amount of bills presented \$5719.29 Order that the Clerk draw a warrant for the relief of Mrs. Margaret Johnson, and that no further relief be allowed until ordered by the Court.

Ordered that the Clerk notify the Treasurer to transfer \$340.00 from the General fund to Road District No. 1 Fund.

Ordered that the application of the Young's River Telephone Company have the right to string wires over the Walluski Bridge. Granted.

Ordered that Supervisor be authorized to purchase lumber at \$10.00 per M. feet to plank road at Westport in Road District No. 11.

Ordered that the matter of repairs to the little Walluski Bridge be continued until the January 1907 term. Report of the Road Master for the month of November, read and ordered filed.

Application of L. B. Wood regarding tax title to lots 10 and 11, Block 2, subdivision of tract 3, Chelsea. Ordered that the Clerk write Mr. H. C. Thompson regarding the matter.

Communication read from the presidents of Road District No. 17, for a change in the road from John Day, at Mill Creek, to A. L. Parker's south corner. Referred to the road master to examine and report.

Plat of Kruse's Second Addition to Gearhart Park, Approved.

The Clerk is directed to ask for bids, from the City papers, for publishing the County Court proceedings for the year 1907. Bids to be filed on or before January 1, 1907.

Clerk directed to write the Seaside Spruce Lumber Company, stating that the county road scraper was returned in a damaged condition, that same would be repaired and the bill sent them for same.

Clerk instructed to ask for bids for furnishing all county drawbridges with oil for the year 1907. Bids to be filed on or before Jan. 1, 1907.

The Clerk is directed to notify all persons receiving aid from the County, that if they expect any assistance from the County during the year 1907, it will be necessary for them to appear before the Court on Jan. 3, 1907, and make proper application for same.

It is ordered that the time be extended, for the delinquent tax sale until January 21, 1907. Ordered that the Clerk publish a notice in the Weekly Astorian asking for bids for boarding the County prisoners for the year 1907. Bids to be filed on or before noon on Saturday December 29, 1906. County Judge and County Clerk are authorized to open the bids and award the contract to the lowest bidder.

Ordered that all road supervisors be notified that all money in their hands belonging to their district must be paid to the County Clerk at the time of filing their report.

Ordered that the Clerk notify the Superintendent of the A. & C. R. R. C., of the needed attention to their culvert on the Clatsop Road, which has been broken or clogged up, causing the county road to be overflowed. The application of F. J. Nelson to use the County Court room and install electric lights is granted with the understanding that the county will be under no expense.

The following Road Tax Levies are approved: 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 12, 14, 15, 16, 17.

Ordered that the clerk notify E. F. Libke, that if he desires to haul logs across the County Road, he must first make proper application and file a good and sufficient bond as heretofore required by the Court.

The Court having examined the minutes of the road meeting called and held in Road District No. 1, on Dec. 10th. And certain tax payers of said district appearing and representing to the court that the district as a whole is not fairly treated in the distribution of said tax. And the Court now being fully advised in the matter. The Court does not approve said levy and the Clerk is instructed to send a copy of this order to the Supervisor and notify him that the Court will

meet on Monday, December 31st, 1906, to further consider any action the district may take in the matter. In the matter of the improvement of the City Extension of Nehalem Road No. 77, the County Surveyor is instructed to survey and plat a county road from the city water works power house to a connection with the Nehalem Road in the City limits near the Travellers Rest, same to be examined by the County Road Master and Mr. T. S. Cornelius, and further that he make a plat showing the owners of the property along the route, in order to allow the court to secure deeds of right of way.
