San Gabriel Arrives in from the Umpqua River.

SHIP HALEWOOD PLAYSTRUANT

Roanoke Due to Leave for the South This Morning-Columbia Expected in from San Francisco-Aztec in from California.

Among the arrivals from sea yesterday was the steamer San Gabriel, in command of Captain Greene, formerly of the steamship Columbia. The San Gabriel came from the Umpqua river with a cargo of 9,000 cases of salmon for S. Elmore & Company. The berthed at the Elmore pler and commenced unloading at once, and will probably get away for the Umpqua some time today or tomorrow. She will load lumber there and proceed direct to her home port, San Pedro. Captain Greene has many friends in these waters and in this city and was kept busy greeting old acquaintances yesterday.

The British ship Halewood, Captain Brew, was one of the victims of the heavy blow of Wednesday night and yesterday morning, dragging her anchors clear across the river from her moorings off the Clatsop mills to a point west of the Taylor Sands. She is all O. K., however, and will be hauled back to the city channel today. Captain Brew happened to be ashore Wednesday night, and was very much astonished, if not dismayed, when he went to the docks yesterday morning and failed to see his fine ship, the mist along the Washington shores hiding her from sight during the forenoon
