JUST A DRUNKEN BRAWL.

Sheriff Pomeroy Returns from Svensen With a Prisoner.

Yesterday morning word was received here that a shooting had taken place near Svensen and that the officers of the law were badly needed up that way, but no names nor details were supplied, and all day long conjecture was rife about the city as to the real parties and the outcome.

Sheriff Pomeroy and Deputy McLean, who went up yesterday morning, on Captain Keating's launch, "Pilot" (which boat was unluckily grounded fast on the sands en route and had not gotten off at a late hour last night) returned to Astoria on 10:35 express last night, with two men, partner to the row at Svensen.

It seems that Jake Johnson, his wife and stepson, Frank Holbrook, all of whom live about a mile back of Svensen, engaged in a drunken row over a gun on Sunday night, late, during which the gun went off, luckily without hurting anyone, but it accentuated the bad blood already boiling, and led to a regular melee in which Holbrook tore the old man's clothes off him and raised Cain generally. The row vibrated all about the neighborhood, all night, more or less, and gave warrant for the summons sent after the officers.

The sheriff brought with him last night both Johnson and Holbrook, the latter as a prisoner, the former as the complaining witness, and both were placed in jail overnight, and the affair will be duly aired in open court sometime today.

PENTECOST PASSES AWAY.

Once Well Known Minister, Lawyer, Educator and Socialist Is Dead.

NEW YORK, Feb. 4.—Hugh Owen Pentecost, minister, lawyer and educator, Socialist in politics, free thinker in religion, died Saturday night at his home in this city at the age of 80 years.

Thirteen years ago Mr. Pentecost was named as an assistant district attorney by Colonel John R. Fellows, but the storm of protest which greeted his appointment called forth by his public utterances of extremely Socialist nature, and particularly the sermon he had preached some years before in which he sympathized with the Chicago Anarchists, caused his resignation before he took the oath of office.

The public knew him well then, but of late years has largely forgotten him. Mr. Pentecost was born in New Harmony, Ind.
