BIRTH RATE LOW.

cabin and hold and took on a few But Low Mortalities Among Children Keeps Up Population.

> LONDON, Feb, 13.-Sir William Dunbar, the registrar-federal, in a report on British vital statistics for 1905, defends a low birth rate, which is generally held to be a sign of a nation's decay. There is some ground, he states for the opinion that moderate birthrates associated with low morals among children, may be more effective toward keeping up the population than higher births associated with high mortality. In too many cases, high birth rates are associated with excessive sickness and mortality during the first few years of life.

Only four European countries had lower birth rates in 1905 than Great Britain but a fact stands out prominently in the report is that the death rate in England and in Wales in 1905 was the lowest on record.
