

TO APPEAR BEFORE COMMITTEE.

Newly Appointed Life Insurance Secretary Visits Several States.

NEW YORK, March 7.—Robert L. Lynn Cox, secretary and attorney for the newly formed association of life insurance presidents, started yesterday on a trip to the capitol of several states to appear before the insurance committees of their legislatures concerning impending insurance legislation.

Mr. Cox will visit among other states Missouri, Arkansas, Texas and Tennessee. He is a former member of the New York Assembly, and was in the Armstrong committee which investigated insurance conditions in this state a year ago.

Just as the brief submitted to the Association by Ex-President Cleveland on Tuesday concerning one bill in particular that is pending in several states was the first step, in the campaign of education that the organization is undertaking to carry on regarding life insurance legislation so Mr. Cox's trip is the first concrete attempt to present its views to the Legislature themselves.

Investment restrictions and tax burdens are two of the subjects to which the present trip of Mr. Cox relates.

The results are awaited with a good deal of interest by the insurance men who were responsible for forming the association.

The primary reason for this is that the Association, according to its announced purpose, will endeavor in future to bring matters of legislation affecting life insurance out in the open through complete publicity.

If the system succeeds, it will probably be followed by other large corporations.

DESCRIBES SCENE OF WRECK.

Captain of Japanese Liner Says Wreck Occurred in Desperate Place.

VICTORIA, March 7.—The steamer Kaga Maru, which arrived last night, brought three Japanese naval cadets bound to England to join a British naval training ship. Captain Curnow, of the Kaga Maru, is familiar with the scene of the Dakota wreck. He says the shore is rocky with outlying reefs and exposed to the open ocean. Near Cape Nofima is Mera Headland, with a ledge extending one and one half miles from shore, and he believes it is on this reef that the steamer struck. 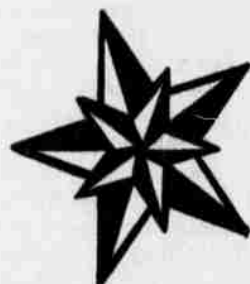
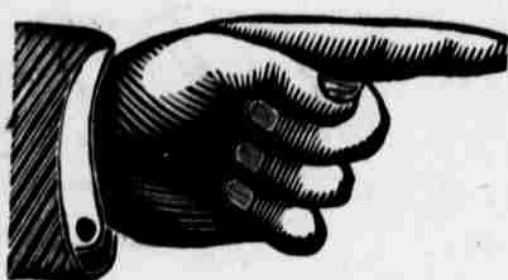
