



Lucky and Unlucky Vegetables. Peas and beans are very important plants in folklore, and there are many superstitions connected with them. Peas were favorite instruments for divination. A pea pod with nine peas was equal to a wishbone when placed above the door. In Northamptonshire it is accounted generally lucky to find nine peas in a pod, or kid. In Mecklenburg, Germany, it is believed that peas must be sown early on Wednesday or Thursday or the birds will carry them off. If they are fed to hens, it is shid that fowls will lay well. They must not, however, be eaten during the Christmas holidays or until after Twelfth day. Beans were mysterious in antiquity. Pliny says they contain the souls of the dead. The Romans used them in religious ceremonles. They were used in Greece as ballots. and Pythagoras desired his disciples not to "love beans"-that is, not interfere with polities. Our phrase "You don't know beans" probably means you are no politician. Ovid prescribes beaus to expel evil spirits.
