PETTIBONE CASE UP

Preliminary Proceedings Started Yesterday in Caldwell.

JUDGE WOODS WILL TRY CASE

Moyer, Haywood and Pettibone Taken From Boise to Caldwell to Stand Trial--All Action Has Been Deferred Until Monday.

BOISE, March 12.—In the district court today at Caldwell, the case against Moyer, Haywood and Pettibone came up on preliminary proceedings. The defendants were all on hand having been taken from Boise this morning. Judge Bryan who was elected last fall announced that he considered himself disqualified by reason of having been appointed attorney for Harry Orchard and that Judge Wood of Boise would sit in the case. Judge Wood was on hand and took the bench this afternoon. It was announced by the prosecution that the remittitur from the supreme court at Washington in the habeas corpus proceedings would not arrive until Friday or Saturday nothing could be done until it came. The defense held that this would not act as a stay, but the court held all action should be deferred and the case went over until Monday.

It developed that since Judge De Haven's decision yesterday, that Ruef has been much more closely guarded by Elisor Biggy and his deputies. He is now allowed to see only his attorneys and immediate family. The Elisor shortly after the decision was rendered told Heney he feared an attempt would be made to rescue Ruef by force and that he considered it prudent to guard him more strongly. He asked if he would be justified in excluding all but Ruef's lawyers and family and Heney told him he certainly would be.

Tonight after the order had gone into effect attorneys Ach and Farrell hunted up Judge Dunne at one of the theatres and complained that Elisor Biggy would not allow Ruef to be seen.

"Won't he permit you, his attorneys to see him?" questioned Judge Dunne.

"Yes" they replied. "Biggy says his counsel and family can come to the room but he refuses entrance to every one else. We'd like an order from you to the contrary."

"I cannot do anything for you, gentlemen" said Dunne, "I approve the action of the elisor."

PARIS PARALYZED.

PARIS, March 11.—The city resumed its normal aspect tonight. All the electric plants are working. The public is alarmed at the ease with which a few hundred workmen at the instigation of the Confederation of Labor are able to throw the population into confusion, and the newspapers printed editorials demanding legislation which will prevent workmen engaging in supplying a public necessity from striking.

It is pointed out that the electricians, now that they know their power, may not rest content with present conditions. It is pointed out as a significant fact that the strike committee is still holding meetings.

BATTLESHIP EXPLOSION

the employees of the arsenal, who were returning to work from luncheon when the powder magazine blew up, and many of them made a rush to ward the dock whence clouds of thick smoke were arising. No one seemed to know what had happened until some one shouted, "The Iena has blown up."

An officer, then called out, "Save yourselves," and all the workmen and others made a rush for the nearest exit from the arsenal.

Many of the crew of the Iena saved their lives by climbing down ladders and reaching the quays whence they fled to places of safety.

The population of Toulon is greatly excited. Many of the crew belong to this place.

Entrance to the arsenal has been forbidden to all but men in uniform. A signal man of the Iena who escaped says that a large number of the crew of the battleship were gathered in the fore part of the ship, listening to a lecture by an officer when the first explosion occurred. Most of these were able to escape.

The officials declare that the magazines of the Iena were completely filled with explosives and that the recurrent detonations indicate that they are all on fire.

Semi-official figures state that it is certain 50 of the crew were killed, 100 seriously injured and 100 slightly injured.
