

LOSS IS ENORMOUS

Longshoremen Strike Has Demoralized Freight Business.

ARBITRATION HOPED FOR

Railroads Refuse Consignments For Abroad—European Customers Sending Inquiries—Congressmen So Great Room Cannot Be Found For Goods

NEW YORK, May 11.—Arbitration is being broached to end the longshoremen's strike but there is little hope as yet of any negotiations being centered into by the parties to the controversy.

The Federation found neither side willing to take the initiative even in a joint discussion of the dispute, so it suggested that instead of each side appointing conferees as it first proposed, negotiations will be taken up by a committee in no way connected with either side.

It was strongly hinted by participants in the meeting of the representatives of the steamship companies which issued an ultimatum to the strikers that the strikers could not hold out much longer but they had no strike fund.

SPANISH HEIR.

His Antecedents—Their Characteristic and Personal Traits.

All Spain is rejoicing at the birth of an heir to the Spanish throne. A British princess's blood will revive the decaying line of Spanish monarchs.

Princess Beatrice, mother of Queen Victoria of Spain, had been greatly attached to Prince Louis Napoleon, ex-Prince Imperial of France, an exceedingly amiable and accomplished gentleman.

Queen Victoria was born in October, 1817, the year of her grandmother's golden jubilee, at Balmoral Castle, Scotland.

Two queen regents, that of Spain and Holland, during the long minorities of their children, ruled their kingdoms

with wisdom, and trained their children with care, fitting them well for their high station.

It is not generally known but the King of Spain, the Queen of Holland, the Emperor Fredericks and the present Czar of Russia's children have all had English governesses and Scotch nurses.

This speaks well for the reliability of the Saxon race, as upon these women the entire responsibility and care of the royal children rested.

The Spanish people will have the conviction that the little Prince will be trained wisely and healthily. It is to be hoped that the heavy underhung jaw of the Austrian, or Hapsburg line will not be transmitted to the royal babe.

Queen Victoria has a wealth of fair hair, and the lovely turquoise blue eyes of the English royal family, she is very accomplished with gentle manners and amiable disposition.

CHANGE OF VENUE.

Decision Reserved in Insurance President's Case.

NEW YORK, May 11.—John B. Stanchfield, representing President Frederick A. Burnham and Auditor George Eldridge of the Mutual Reserve, jointly indicted for grand larceny and perjury, yesterday argued before Justice Dowling for a change of venue, on the ground that the proceedings were strong against insurance companies and officials in New York county.

Assistant District Attorney Nott opposed the motion and Justice Dowling reserved decision, postponing the trial of President Burnham to a week from May 13, to give him time to decide the motion.

HAYWOOD PARADE

Chicago Police Will Make it a Peaceful Affair.

NO REB BANNERS OR FLAGS

Chief of Police Has Request For Permit to Hold Parade Under Advice—Declares He Will No Allow Gatherings in Streets.

CHICAGO, May 11.—The police department has determined that the proposed demonstration in behalf of Moyer and Haywood which the Socialists and labor unions of a socialistic leaning are getting up for May 19 shall be a peaceful affair.

When a committee representing the Cook County Moyer-Haywood conference called on Chief Shippy yesterday it was not given a permit for the parade off hand.

Later Chief Shippy intimated that a permit for the parade probably will be issued but he declared he would not allow gathering in the downtown streets.

While Chief Shippy would not confirm the report, it was said that a promise will be exacted from the Moyer-Haywood conference people that no red banners or red flags be carried in the parade.
