NEW YORK, May 11.-Arbitration h being broached to end the longshoremen's strike but there is little hope as yet, of any negotiations being centered into by the parties to the controversy. The National Civic Federa. tion has been sounding the representatives of the steamship companies and the strikers' leaders, but its efforts have bee almost negative.

The Federation found neither side willing to take the initiative even in a toint discussion of the dispute, so it suggested that instead of each side appointing conferees as it first proposed, negotiations will be taken up by a committee in no way connected with either side. The steamship managers received this latter proposal kindly, but did not say they would not ignore such a committee if it were formed. The strikers' leader and spokesman, Patrick Conners, said that whereas the strikers would not appoint a committee to confer with one from the steamship companies they would be received by the strikers. The statement of Conners is looked upon by the federation as offering a hope that nego. tiations can be begun. Ralph M. Easley, chairman of the executive committee to the federation, explained that that body was not discouraged, but would keep up its efforts today. The federation, he said, would try to obtain the consent of the companies and secure the appointment of an outside committee.
