UNION EMPLOYMENT AGENCY.

New Project Being Put Forth By Several Railroads in Chicago.

CHICAGO, May 15 .- Several of the railroads centering in Chicago are considering the advisability of establishng a union employment bureau, with a view to insuring a better grade of operating employees.

Great secrecy is maintained regarding the project because the bitter opposition of labor organization is feared.

In the operating conference which recently have been held by one or two roads here, the subject was received with unanimous approval. If such a bureau is estab'ished it will have a complete list of all operating employs in the United States, with the com plete record of the service of each, It is stated that the demand for op-
