WATERFRONT ITEMS

Two Big Freighters Heavily Loaded Pass Out.

LURLINE AGAIN DROPS A TRIP

Office at the Callender Dock Undergoing Alterations, Second Story Being Added For Clerical Staff Which Will Form Commanding Lookout.

The steamer Telegraph was down from Portland at 1 o'clock after a day's lay over on Thursday. She brought down a goodly number of passengers and some freight. Mr. Mitchell is very busy at the Callender wharf, as extensive alterations are being carried out in the offices. A portion of the roof has been raised and a second story is being added for the convenience of the clerical staff. The space intervening between this present floor of the main roof and that portion which is raised will be filled in with glass thus affording a splendid outlook over the river and improving matters generally. At other odd times when he has a moment or two to spare Mr. Mitchell is busily engaged chasing stray dogs off the wharf. These he says, besides being numerous, are a very great nuisance and so expert has he become in approaching them unaware that he is seriously thinging of throwing up his present berth and applying for the position of dogcatcher in some large city.

At the Astoria Iron Works they are busy at work on the cylinders of the gasoline boat "Teddy Roosevelt." She was laid up last winter with water in her, and during the first frost this froze, the consequence being cracked cylinders. An attempt is being made to repair the present cylinders but it is almost a foregone conclusion that this will prove abortive and the result will necessitate practically a new engine, as the vessel is of the three-cylinder type.

The lighthouse tender Columbine sails Monday for a tour of the light-houses. She will also carry material for a dwelling to be erected at Point Robinson for the lighthouse keepers. These men have a dwelling on shore in which to recuperate in their off duty spells. A crew of mechanics will also go along to construct the dwelling.

The steamer Elmore came in yesterday morning. She goes to Portland to drydock and will undergo a general overhauling. Meanwhile Capt. Schrader will have time to enjoy himself ashore.

The bark Louisiana was still lying in the stream late yesterday. She was waiting for a crew which has been sent for to Seattle. They were expected on last night's train.

The large steamship Nicomedia of the Portland Asiatic Line, very heavily loaded with wheat, passed down the river at 2:30 yesterday on her voyage to the East.

The large tramp steamer Norman Isles came down yesterday morning loaded with wheat from Portland. Her destination is Hong Kong.

The barkentine Griffith was towed down yesterday by the tug Wallula. She passed Astoria about 1:30 and was lumber-laden.

The gasoline boat Berwick passed on her way to Rogue River from Portland. She carried supplies for Humes' Logging Camp.

The steamship G. W. Elder was in yesterday on her way through from Portland to San Pedro.

The steamship Lurline had again to drop a trip yesterday in order to catch up with her schedule.

The schooner Quinault passed down the river, lumber-laden, bound for San Francisco.

The Excelsior, bound for San Francisco, passed down yesterday from Portland.

The oil tank Asuncion from San Francisco has gone up to Portland.

The steamer Heather passed out at 6:50 a. m. yesterday morning.
