BREWERIES BOYCOTTED.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., May 20.—Unless the breweries of the city attempt to sell non-union beer the brewers will not strike before next May. At Saturday night's meeting of the Brewers' Union it was decided to abide by their contract as long as the proprietors did nothing to violate the agreement that is now in force. At the present the bottlers, drivers, ship-
pers and stable men are on strike to support their demands for an increase of wages and at Saturday night's meeting of the brewers the question of going out on a sympathetic strike was considered but was voted down. A boycott has been declared against the breweries that have refused to grant the increase and unionists have been asked not to patronize them.
