## WATERFRONT ITEMS

Elmore Badly Needed to Carry Supplies.

### COSTA RICA AND HYADES TODAY

Tillamook County Is Sorely in Need of Food Supplies and Has Large Quantity of Produce Ready to Ship—Holiday Keeps Things Quiet.

Tillamook people have been inconvenienced through shortage of the necessities of life, owing to the lack of transportation facilities. For years the steamer Sue Elmore has plied between Astoria and Tillamook in the freight and passenger trade. About three weeks ago she was taken up the river for repairs and a general overhauling. She will not resume her run for a week or more yet.

During the enforced idleness of the Elmore, her owners secured no other steamer to take her place. No groceries, drygoods or any other class of freight has been taken to Tillamook since the Elmore has been off her run. Bay City, one of the principal towns in that section, reports its stock of supplies is practically exhausted. The Elmore's dock at Astoria is overcrowded with freight awaiting shipment. At the other end of the line big shipments of farm produce are waiting to be forwarded in this direction.

The Sue Elmore belongs to Samuel Elmore, of Astoria. She has been the only boat running to Tillamook, which is situated in the heart of a dairying and farming country. There has been some talk of trying to get steamers plying between here and Coos Bay to stop in there with a shipment of supplies. It is said there is enough freight at the docks at each end of the route to keep the Elmore busy a month, not including shipments which will be offered in the meantime.

The steamers Hyades and Costa Rica are completing cargoes for San Francisco. The Hyades will finish loading 4000 tons of wheat at the Greenwich dock. The Costa Rica sails for the Bay City at 9 o'clock today with a cargo of miscellaneous freight and a big list of passengers.

The schooner Alumna sailed from San Pedro May 28th for Astoria.

The Lurline came down at 8 o'clock last night. The boiler-makers did not get their repair work done on her till 9 o'clock yesterday morning and consequently did not get away till 10 a. m. She left on her return trip about 9:30.

The steamship Alliance came down yesterday at noon. She was as usual, loaded with freight to her utmost capacity and had besides, many passengers.

The three-masted schooner William Renton anchored in the stream yesterday afternoon. She is in ballast.

The tow boat Sampson came up with a barge and left her in the stream opposite Uniontown yesterday.

The Tellus will be down today to load lumber at the Knappton mills for Sidney, Australia.

The steamer Elder will tie up at the Callender wharf today and will leave at 3:30 prompt.

The three-masted barkentine John Smith lumber laden passed down about 1 o'clock.

The steamship Whittier came in yesterday morning and went on up the river.

The oil tank Argyle went up the river at 2 o'clock yesterday.

The steamship Hyades was expected down last night.

## DEATH OF FINNISH MINISTER

ERL VIRKKI SUCCUMBS TO PNEUMONIA WEDNESDAY NIGHT—HAD ONLY BEEN IN THE CITY A MONTH.

The Rev. Erl Virkki, pastor of the Finnish Church in Uniontown, died on Wednesday night of pneumonia. Mr. Virkki had only been in the city about one month when he was stricken down with what proved a fatal attack of the pulmonary complaint. He leaves a widow and one child, a boy. Only a young man, he was but 34 years of age, he came here from Red Lodge, Montana, where he had officiated for four years. Previous to that he had been one year in Duluth, Minnesota. He was a well educated man and a member of many organizations. During the seven years which he had spent in the United States he had held the position of school teacher in a Finnish Seminary, and had been editor of a Finnish newspaper, in the east, where he was well known, and considered an able preacher. He had also the gift of tongues to a considerable extent speaking at least five different languages. His father was a sea captain. The funeral will be in charge of the United Finnish brotherhood, the members of which organization are requested to meet at the Uniontown church at 12:30 today, the 31st inst.

SHANGHAI, May 30.—The famine which has prevailed for many weeks, causing hundreds of deaths and great suffering, has been broken. The crops are still thin but the hot weather of the past month has been favorable to a good yield.

American gifts have supplied milk regularly to 106 babies at the Bau Chou Fu temple, while 200 more have been nourished occasionally. The children are left with their parents or relations as the Chinese dread foreign orphanages.

What is left of the gifts will be turned over to the Red Cross society to relieve individual cases of need and to grapple with the next crisis.
