Average Rainfall, Wind, Heat and Cold For Month of June.

The following data covering a period of four years have been compiled from the weather bureau records at North Head, Wash. They apply to the months of June only and are not a forecast, but simply the averages for the past four years:

Mean temperature, 54 deg.; warmest month, 56 deg.; coldest month, 53 deg.; Precipitation, average 0.58 ins. greatest monthly 4.39 inches; least monthly, 1.24 inches; average clear days, 5; partly cloudy, 8; cloudy, 17; prevailing wind, northwest.

## WATERFRONT ITEMS

Much Business Along Astoria's Waterfront.

### ORIENTAL LINER NUMANTIA IN

A Continual Go and Come From Early Morning Till Night With Several Large Vessels Lying in the Stream.

Astorian concerning the steamer Sue Elmore it appears that certain statements therein were erroneous. It is therefore only seemly to correct them. The Elmore went up the river for repairs a week ago last Sunday, not three weeks ago. The repairs which were found necessary were more than had been anticipated, or the delay would not have been so great. The steam schooner Evie has taken the Elmore's place ever since the latter was laid up, and has done nothing but run between Astoria and Tillamook ever since. There is not a full cargo of freight awaiting the Elmore at her dock; in fact, not three-quarters of a complete load.

While towing the ship Clan Graham from Royal Roads to Victoria harbor, to be hauled out on the Victoria machinery depot ways, the tug Lorne grounded Thursday night at Seals Point. The vessel is not injured and is expected to float at high tide.

The Costa Rica went out yesterday afternoon bound for Frisco. She carried a goodly number of passengers and considerable freight amongst which were several hundred bags of oysters.

The Joseph Pulitzer, pilot schooner, came up the river today and anchored off Uniontown. She is in for supplies and will leave for the mouth of the river again shortly.

The steamer Miller will be on her old run again next week. Her repairs are nearly completed and she looks very spic and span in her new coat of green and white paint.

The steamer Numantia crossed the bar at 4:40 a. m. yesterday. She was bound up the river and was from the east with a cargo of Oriental goods.

The steam schooner Jim Butler tied up at the Callendar wharf yesterday morning and discharged freight. She hails from San Pedro.

The bark Agate came down lumber-laden from Vancouver. She is bound for San Francisco and had 400,000 feet of lumber aboard.

The German bark Tellus (Hamburg) is in the stream, waiting to be towed across to Knappton to load lumber for Australia.
