G. N. TRAIN STOLEN

Passenger Train Taken From Station by Hoodlum.

TRAIN CREW WERE AT LUNCH

After Chasing Engine and Cars Up and Down the Track Nearly Killing Train Crew the Train Was Stopped by the Tough Very Abruptly.

BELLINGHAM, June 10.—The Great Northern Seattle-Bellingham local train was at 10 o'clock last night stolen from the depot where it was left for a few minutes while the crew went to lunch by Barkley McCutcheon, a tough who threw open the throttle, starting the engine north at a terrific space. The bell was ringing and the whistle blowing madly. The train crew rushed for a speeder and followed until it was discovered that the man at the valve had reversed the train and was returning south. He had the train under full speed and it was only by a miracle that the pursuing crew were able to get off the track. McCutcheon later stopped the train, bringing it to an abrupt stop and causing a friction that nearly ignited the iron.

McCutcheon, who is about 22 years old, was very much pleased with his experience and under the excitement of the numerous narrow escapes was very nervous. He was taken to the city jail and locked up.
