FAMOUS BURGLAR

International Crook a Free Man in London.

HE WAS ON DEVIL'S ISLAND

Eddie Guerin is Only Man Who Ever Escaped Alive From Devil's Island—English Authorities Refuse To Return Him To France.

CHICAGO, June 15.—The Inter-Ocean today says: Eddie Guerin, the international burglar and safe cracker, and the only man to accomplish the feat of escaping alive from the French penal prison, Devil's Island, where Dreyfus was at one time a prisoner, is walking the streets of London a free man, according to news received in Chicago last night. Guerin who came to Chicago after his escape from Devil's Island went from here to London, where he was recaptured. His case has been a thorn in the side of British justice.

Guerin's last release came following the decision that the man who perpetrated one of the boldest crimes that ever set the French capital talking, is a

British subject, and on that account cannot be given up to the French authorities.

Edward Guerin is catalogued in Inspector Byrnes book as a notorious western criminal. In 1901 he was convicted in Paris of robbing the American Express Company of \$30,000 and of a previous robbery of \$50,000 from the Bank of Lyons. The court gave the extreme penalty of imprisonment for life on Devil's Island.

MORE PLEAD GUILTY.

Seven Other Furniture Firms Were Fined In Federal Court.

PORTLAND, June 15.—Seven more furniture firms pleaded guilty in the Federal district court to having been associated with others to restrain interstate commerce. They were John S. Baker, Pendleton; R. Veal, Albany; A. H. Lippmann, Prineville; Standard Furniture Co., Baker City. These were fined \$25. J. L. Sharon, Lewis Hunter and L. A. Eddings of Pendleton, were fined \$10 each.

HAMPTON ROADS DISASTER.

Investigating Board Finds Launch Was Cut In Two By Towline. WASHINGTON, June 15.—Secretary of the Navy Metcalf today received a report that the board which has been investigating the drowning of the midshipmen and sailors in Hampton Roads, on Monday night, will find that the launch was cut in two by a wire cable tow line. The Secretary said that he will wait for a formal report before announcing any details.

MRS. WONG SUN YUE

Mrs. Gould's Sister Renounces Citizenship Rights.

MARRIED CHINESE MERCHANT

She Will Be Subject To Chinese Immigration Laws and To Immigration Restriction Laws of This Country When She Returns For a Visit.

CHICAGO, June 15.—A dispatch to the Record Herald from San Francisco says:

Mrs. Wong Sun Yue, sister of Mrs. Howard Gould is no longer an American citizen. She voluntarily relinquished her rights as a native born Californian yesterday to become as much as possible an all-round Chinese, like her husband.

The records of the local Chinese bureau are lacking in cases similar to that of Mrs. Wong Sun Yue. She will be subject to the laws of China when she visits that country and when she comes home she will be subject to the regulations of the immigration and restriction laws.

Mrs. Yue, who renounced her citizenship to become a Chinese merchant said: "As a Chinese merchant many paths are open to me which were closed before. I have become a member of the tailoring firm called the Quong Yuen Yiek. Its dragon for me instead of the stars and stripes."

BIG DAM REPORTED OUT.

Chambers Lake Dam Said To Have Been Carried Away.

FORT COLLINS, Colo., July 15.—Great fear is felt here over a report from up the river that the big dam at Chambers Lake, which has been holding back 70,000,000 cubic feet of water, has gone out and that a wall of water five high is now rushing down the Cache La Poudre River. It is believed that all the people living in the lowlands and on the river bank have escaped, but it is feared that many fishermen may have been caught in the flood.

LUMBER BROKER SUICIDE.

ST. LOUIS, June 15.—Samuel Haskins, a wealthy lumber broker of Glasgow, Scotland, who has been living at the Buckingham Club for a year, committed suicide last night by drinking carbolic acid in a vacant lot in Olive street. The police found no evidence to show the cause of the act.

TAFT IS IMPROVED.

ST. PAUL, June 15.—Secretary Taft, who became suddenly ill at Fort Snelling yesterday, is much better. Mr. Taft told the doctor that last night was the first time in three weeks in which he had had a good night's rest. The Secretary will leave tonight for Sioux Falls and other Northwest points.

ELI BUSH DEAD.

ONTARIO, Or., June 15.—Eli E. Bush, a highly respected citizen of Malheur county, died at Westfall yesterday, aged 71 years. He was a pioneer, and helped blaze the trail for western travel.
