ON FRIENDLY TERMS

Knapp Predicts Good Feeling Between Railroads and Public.

Chairman of Interstate Commerce Commission Talks On Railway Situation and Prophecies Bring Future for Both the Railroads and the People.

CHICAGO, June 17.-A dispatch to the Tribune from Washington, says: "An era of good feeling between the railroads and the public, with consequent beneficent effect upon the material welfare of the United States, is pre-Opposite Ross, Higgins & Co dicted by Martin A. Knapp, chairman of the Interstate Commiss

In an interview yesterday he pressed the belief that present railway onditions would improve, that in his opinion an abundance of capital would found in time to make the needed extensions and improvements to carry Coffee with Pie or Cake 10c on the constantly growing traffic of the country. He declared that in the future, if he read the signs of the times aright, railroad men would be found giving their support, instead of opposing well considered measures having for their purpose the federal regulation control of commerce between the

Chairman Knapp believes there will supplemental milroad legislation, but that it will have the aproval of the railroad men as well as the public. He expressed the opinion that a well considered law regulating the issue of future securities would in effect give an official sanction to the certificates that would greatly aid in their sale by the assurance thereby given to the buyer. Mr. Knapp said it was his belief that the general railroad situation would improve. He pointed out the fact that confidence in the integrity and value of leading railroad securities had been restored and that the danger of further drastic Legislation by the state would

seem to have nearly disappeared.

Mr. Knapp indorsed the proposal to exempt railways from the operation of the Sherman anti-trust law to the extent of at least permitting them to make pooling arrangements subject to certain restrictions. The belief prevails in some quarters that polling was con sidered under governmental supervision, a step would thus be taken in nullifying the anti-trust act as far as the rail roads are concerned, thereby removing the inconsistencies in the enforcement of the act to regulate commerce and the act aimed at combinations in restraint of trade. Mr. Knapp said that such a concert of action between roads, was ab-olutely necessary to the suitable conduct of railway operations and altogether in the public interest.


