TWO MORE BODIES RECOVERED. Additional Victims of Minnesota Launch Disaster Come To Surface.

WASHINGTON, June 18.—Rear Admiral Brownson tonight received a dispatch from Rear Admiral Emory in command of the fleet in Hampton Roads, stating that two more victims of the Minnesota launch accident were recovered late this afternoon.

NEWPORT NEWS, June 19.—The waters of Hampton Roads gave up the bodies of five more victims of the Minnesota's launch, two midshipmen and three seamen.

DANCED HERSELF TO DEATH.

Girl Attends Dance and Later Dies of Heart Failure.

BROOKLYN, June 18.—Mary Schmidt, a pretty 18-year-old girl, of 205 North Seventh street, went to a dance at Coney Island last night and died early this morning of heart failure in the Eastern District Hospital.

The girl, with Mary Schwartz, who lives in the same house, attended the reception of a social club in a Coney Island resort. It was said that she danced every dance, and about midnight when she began to feel faint, set out for home with her companion.

When the car reached the plaza at the Williamsburg bridge the Schwartz

girl spoke to her companion, and discovered that Miss Schmidt was insensible. The conductor called a policeman, and the two carried the girl from the car. She was taken to the Eastern District Hospital, where Dr. Snyder found that she had been attacked by syncope.

BABY DRINKS BENZINE.

BROOKLYN, June 18.—Little Mary Davis, two and a half years old, of 59 Bolivar street, was removed to the Brooklyn Hospital last night by Ambulance Surgeon Parker, suffering terribly from benzine poisoning.

RUSSIAN REGIMENT REVOLTS.

CASTRO INTERVIEW

Predicts Development of Venezuelan Resources.

THE REBEL PROOF COUNTRY

President Castro Says An Era of Peace Has Come and Next Few Years Will See Great Progress—Two Railroads Contemplated.

NEW YORK, June 18.—H. B. Kates, a New York business man who has just returned from Venezuela, has made public the gist of an interview he had recently with President Castro, of Venezuela, regarding the development of Venezuela.

"I was with him an hour," Mr. Kates said, "and during most of the time he talked of the country and its future. He told me he was greatly pleased with the moral force the country showed during his illness.

In speaking of the schemes for developing the country he said that plans were in mind for two railroads which are destined to open up the richest part of Venezuela.

"President Vastro told me that after he had established everything at home on an absolutely staple bases he will encourage the investment of foreign capital and the establishment of a strong bank to help exploit the natural resources of the country."

MEXICAN SUBSIDY.

Government Has Now Paid Five Million To Railroad.

MEXICO CITY, June 17.—J. M. Neeland, general manager of the Pan-American railroad called from the Mexican government \$1,200,000 as the third payment of the subsidy which was granted by the Mexican government, making the total paid to date \$5,000,000 and leaving a balance of \$2,000,000 which will be paid when the railroad reaches the Guatemalan border.

RUEF BEFORE JUDGE LAWLOR.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 18.—Abe Ruef appeared before Judge Lawlor yesterday afternoon to answer to the indictments of the grand jury, with complicity in the United States bribery. He was represented by an attorney, ad whose request the proceeding was continued one week.

HEAT PROSTRATIONS.

CHICAGO, June 18.—Three deaths and many prostrations because of the heat were reported this morning. The mercury at 10 o'clock was 87 degrees, one degree higher than at the same hour yesterday.

CREMATED HIS BODY.

COPENHAGEN, June 18.—A land owner named Christophersen, said to be a religious fanatic and desiring to die as the reformer, John Husse did, saturated himself with oil, and set himself on fire. He was cremated.

BUBONIC PLAGUE AT TRINIDAD.

WILLEMSTAD, Curacao, June 18.—An outbreak of the bubonic plague has occurred at Port of Spain, Trinidad, according to the steamer Prinz Wilhelm I, which arrived today. The vessel which is bound for New York, was quarantined.

BEHEADED BY TRAIN.

Alderman Collects \$750 a Month For Houses of Ill Repute.

BROOKLYN, June 18.—While attempting to board a Manhattan-bound Brighton Beach train at the Brighton Beach station early this afternoon William Wyeth, 30 years old, of 519 Sixth street, fell between two cars. The wheels passed over his neck, severing the head from the body. The corpse was removed to the Sheepshead By station.
