EXPLOSION OF GAS

Eight Sections of Walk Torn up in Chicago.

HOTEL GUESTS IN PANIC

Firemen Were Overcome By Escaping Gas—Three Injured By Being Thrown Into Air By Explosion—Sparks From Arc Light the Cause.

CHICAGO, June 19.—An explosion of gas blew up eight sections of the stone sidewalk in front of the Dearborn Hotel, 398-404 State Street, last night, causing a panic among the guests and injuring several persons. Guests ran through the corridors screaming and climbed down the fire escapes. Three firemen in attempting to shut off the gas were overcome and had to be carried to the street by comrades.

When the explosion lifted the sidewalk three men were passing the hotel. They were raised in the air and fell back into the basement with the broken flagstones. One of them suffered injuries to his leg, the other one was stunned.

After the explosion the hotel was left in darkness and the building soon filled with fumes from open gas jets. Firemen entered the building and groped about turning off the gas. It was while trying to repair a leak in the pipe that the firemen were overcome.

The explosion is thought to have been caused by sparks from an arc light which fell to the walk and ignited escaping gas. The lamp post was thrown through a window of a pawn shop by the crash.

WAGE ADVANCE.

Chicago Freight Handlers Will Get Increase in Pay.

CHICAGO, June 19.—Five thousand freight handlers in the employ of the railroads in Chicago probably will receive wage advances amounting to \$250,000 annually, within the next few days. The St. Paul road yesterday offered its men a seven percent increase in pay and other railroads are expected to follow the example.

The St. Paul employees at a meeting last night practically accepted the wage offer although it is less than the advance demanded by the union, which was about 12 1/2 percent. This makes the second increase by freight handlers within the last year, an advance of one cent an hour having been granted by all roads last September. Announcement was also made that all clerks in the freight houses of the St. Paul and Northwestern roads will receive an increase in pay amounting to ten percent beginning July 1.

On the northward trip a large box of flowers was deposited in the sea near the spot where Mrs. Prentice was buried on the previous trip. Mrs. Prentice died of cancer and was buried at sea, although her daughter, who was on board, protested. Dr. Prentice, the husband, is suing the company.

CONSTRUCTION FINISHED.

Arizona and California Railroad Completed and Trains Running.

PHOENIX, Ariz., June 19.—The Arizona & California Railroad has finished the construction of its line from Wickensburg to Parker, on the Colorado River, and regular train service was started today. On the twentieth bids will be opened in Prescott for construction of the foundation for a bridge over the Colorado river. Contracts for the steel has already been let and the steel is being manufactured. All contracts are let to be completed before the high water season of the Colorado in the Summer of 1908. Meanwhile grading through the foothills on the California side of the river will be prosecuted. From that point to Bengal, Colorado, where connection will be made with the Santa Fe coast lines, the line is over a flat desert, through which construction will be inexpensive. The through line will be completed within 18 months.
