GERMANY AROUSED.

BERLIN, June 22.—The confirmation by M. Pichon, French Minister of Foreign Affairs, yesterday, of the new so-called triple alliance between Great Britain, France and Spain, to guarantee their insular and Mediterranean possessions, has aroused great indignation here. The new alliance is regarded as aimed directly at Germany and, as such, is thoroughly condemned.

GOLD CONTINUES.

Large Shipment of Gold Was Shipped To London.

NEW YORK, June 22.—Further engagements of gold for export to Europe, which since the present movement began has reached nearly \$20,000,000 were taken today. The Russo-Chinese Bank, which engaged \$1,100,000 for London yesterday, engaged \$650,000, additional today. This gold also will be shipped to the London market.

TREASURES STOLEN

Safe and Money Stolen From Sunken.

SUBMARINETHIEVES UNKNOWN

Expert Divers Discover Theft of \$50,000 Belonging To Haytian Government Sunken During Trouble With Germans In 1902.

TAMPA, June 22.—Two expert divers, John L. McPherson and Simon Grant of this city have brought from Hayti a tale of one of the strangest robberies on record. It was the theft of a safe containing \$50,000 from the bottom of the sea, where it had lain in a sunken hulk for nearly five years.

The divers had been engaged to recover the treasure from the Haytian gunboat Crete Perriot, which was sunk in Gonaives harbor September, 6 1902, after an encounter with the German gunboat Panther. It appears that the Haytian gunboat commanded by Admiral Kalliek took part in a revolution against the Haytian government. To further the cause a German merchantman, the steamer Markomannin was boarded and arms and ammunition seized. The commander of the Panther was notified and he soon cornered the Haytian gunboat in Gonaive harbor and fired at her. Those on board the Crete Perriot, rather than let the ship fall into the hands of the Germans, exploded a charge of dynamite in the ship and caused her to sink. Several men were lost with the vessel. It was known at the time that the safe in the admiral's quarters contained money and valuables to the amount of \$50,000. No effort was made to recover this until recently, when divers were engaged to locate it. The divers had no difficulty in locating the sunken ship nor in locating the admiral's ship. But when they sought the safe they found it had been taken away. The condition of the cabin indicated that it had been removed recently. The Haytian officials, the divers say, were astounded at the revelation but could find no clue to the identity of the submarine thieves.
