DEATH ROOM DESECRATED.

NEW YORK, June 26.-Not deterred by the fact that the body of a dead man was lying in the room, a couple of burglars entered the home of John Turnbull at 398 Stuyvesant avenue last night and rifled a china closet of silverware amounting to \$100. The robbery is said to have taken place shortly before midnight and was witnessed by one of the domestics, who screamed too late to halt the flight of the hurgiars. Strangely enough, just one year ago today the house next to the Turnbull residence at No. 400, which is on the corner, was robbed by the notorious Masonic burgiar, Metelski, who got 40 years in Sing Sing.

CHANGES TACTICS.

Harriman Adopts New Attitude Towards Railroads to Further Financial End.

CHICAGO, June 26 .- A dispatch to the Tribune from Washington says: E. H. Harriman has adopted a new attitude toward the Chicago & Alton Railroad, different from the predatory policy which members of the Inter-State Commerce Commission alleged he observed towards that property.

Authoritative information has reached here to the effect that in order to prevent the passing of a dividend recently on Chicago & Alton, Harriman made a loan of \$1,000,000 to that line, to be used, for improvements. It has been the history of the road under the dual arrangement between Harriman and the Rock Island system that in the years it was controlled by the latter, it made money, while this was not the case in alternate years,

At the last meeting of the parties to the agreement in New York it was announced by representatives of the Rock Island for the year aggregated \$1,000,-00 but as the road needed improvements etc. Harriman instantly objected, insisting that the dividend should be issued. To practical financiers, who listhat would follow.

However, the representatives of the Rock Island were in control and Harriman, after thinking a few moments proposed to make a personal loan of \$1,000,000 at 5 per cent to be paid in 1915, if the board would declare Jivi-The board insisted that the proposal should be made in writing and the railroad magnate was compelled to send for the general counsel of his road, who drew up the necessary papers.

DEATH COMES AS RELIEF.

Aged Woman Stricken 4 Days Ago, Dies Without Gaining Consciousness.

CHICAGO, June 26 .- Without the comforting cheer of her only child, said to be the wife of a wealthy Evanston lumber merchant, Mrs. Marie Urnholdt, 72 years old, died last night in her little flat. The end came after three days of unconsciousness, the result of an attack of paralysis. Mrs. Urnholdt was stricken last Saturday, and lay unattended on the floor of her bedroom for 52 hours before being discovered. Although she refrained from telling her daughters name, the aged woman frequently muttered her given name as if wishing to

ee her before she died. When relatives were asked last night for the name of the daughter, they refused to divulge it.

KILLS HIS TWO CHILDREN.

WILMINGTON, Del., June 26.—Because his two children had been playing with a colored child, John Kanne became so incensed late last night that he shot both as they lay in bed and then killed himself. The children are not expected to live. They are Rose, 2 years old, and John, 5 years old. The father was intoxicated at the time.
