THE PASS QUESTION

Railroads in Quandary as to Issuing Right.

TWO CENT RATE EFFECTIVE

Western Roads Trying To Decipher To Whom Free Transportation May Be Issued—Federal and State Laws Conflict on the Subject.

CHICAGO, June 26.—Railroads in the West are in a quandary as to whom they may issue free transportation without coming in contact with some state or national official. Under existing laws a minister may travel in one state free and in another must pay full fare, whereas under the United States statute he may travel through both states on a pass.

After considering the proposition from all standpoints the executives of the Western railroads have called on the legal departments for copies of all and will promulgate instructions based on the best in all the laws governing free transportation.

The executives of the Western railroads it was said decided to comply with the state laws making a two cent rate and agents were instructed to put the rates into effect as soon as the laws become effective.

In the matter of Interstate rates, the passenger department have been in effect as soon after July 1 as possible, basing the rates on the laws in the western states.

COMSTOCK MAKES ARREST.

NEW YORK, June 26.—Anthony Comstock made a tour of Coney Island today in search of obscene pictures. He visited several penny amusement resorts and looked into the slot machines. He said that he had several warrants in his pocket for dealers who were found selling obscene postal cards. Shortly before noon he raided a postal card stand at Surf avenue, near West Third street, and arrested the owner, Morris Graut.
