THE PASS QUESTION

Railroads in Quandary as to Is-

Western Roads Trying To Decipher To Whom Free Transportation May Be Issued-Federal and State Laws Con-

CHICAGO, June 26 .- Railroads in the West are in a quandary as to whome they may issue free transportation without coming in contact with some state or national official. Under existing laws a minister may travel in one state free and in another must pay full fare, whereas under the United States statute he may travel through both states on a pass.

After considering the proposition from all standpoints the executives of the Western railroads have called on the legal departments for copies of all and will promulgate instructions based on the best in all the laws governing free transportation.
