KING'S BIRTHDAY

List of King's Birthday Honors to be Conferred.

FOUR NEW PEERS NAMED

The List is Unusually Interesting This Year Because of the Recognition Accorded Art, Science and Literature—Rewards of Political or Civil Services

LONDON, June 28.—The list of the King's birthday honors that usually are conferred as a reward of political and civil service is more interesting than usual this year, because of the recognition accorded art, science and literature. Four new peers have been named by the King—Sir James Kibben, the former Lord Mayor of London, Sir James Blyth, who has devoted his wealth to the campaign against tuberculosis; Sir Samuel Montague and Alexander Peckover, the two later being bankers.

The new baronets include Sir W. H. Holland, of Manchester, Cotton spinner; Sir Charles Scottier, Chairman of the London & Southwestern railway and Sir William P. Treloar, lord mayor of London.

More than 30 knightships have been bestowed, the recipients of this honor, including William R. Gremer, M. P., the peace advocate; Dr. James Donaldson, principal of St. Andrews University; Nathaniel Dunlop, chairman of the Allan Steamship Line; W. S. Gilbert, the playwright, and Professor Hubert von Herkomer, and W. Q. Orchardson, the artists and Professor John Rhys, of Oxford, who represented that university at the recent peace conference in New York.

Among the promotions to the various orders of the Bath, St. Michaels and St. George, etc., are the following: Professor Edward Ray Lankester, Sir William MacGregor, governor of New Foundland, Sydney Olivier, governor of Jamaica; Charles Fitzpatrick, chief justice of Canada; Captain R. H. Anstruther, senior naval officer in New Foundland waters, and President Shaughnessy of this Canadian Pacific Railway.
