Weather Reports by Wireless to Local Forecaster.

S. S. ARABIA GOES TO SEA

The Bark Emily Whitney Comes Down With a Big Load-The Columbia Was In Early Yesterday-Inspectors Due Today At An Early Hour.

The Oriental liner Arabia left out resterday with a full cargo bound for Hong King and way ports on her fifth voyage of the year.

The Norwegian steamer Finn was expected to leave down last evening. She will go to Tacoma to take lumber to an Australian port.

Wireless messages giving the condition of the weather at sea are being received regularly from the steamer President, which assists District Foreeaster Beals in preparing his daily forecasts. One received at 12 o'clock last night, when the steamer was 150 miles south of North Head, states that there was a light wind, southerly breeze, barometer 34.14. Though the glass is rather high, the weather man predicts showers will occur tonight and tomor

The steamer Breakwater will arrive Thursday and will run between the olumbia River and Coos Bay, her port being Marshfield.
