THE HAYWOOD TRIAL

Further Reading of San Francisco Depositions

MILLER FEDERATION COUNSEL

Score of Witnesses Who Will Be Called By the State Have Arrived in Boise —They Come Chiefly From North Idaho and Colorado.

BOISE, Ida., July 9.—With the exception of Charles M. Moyer, the President and treasurer of the Western Federation of Miners, the defense in the Steuenberg murder trial will today close its case, in direct.

A portion of the morning session having been given to the further reading of depositions, taken in San Francisco two or three witnesses came up for examination. Among these is Fred Miller, of the attorneys for W. D. Haywood. When Miller acted as attorney for Harry Orchard, when the self confessed murderer of Steuenberg was arrested at Caldwell. According to witnesses for the state, Miller, who practices in Spokane sent a telegram to Orchard when he was in jail at Caldwell announcing that he was coming to his assistance. This message, it is charged, was in pursuance of an arrangement made by Haywood that the Western Federation of Miners would defend the murderer. So far the defense has not denied that Miller was retained in the interest of the Western Federation but it is maintained that Haywood sent the telegram to Silver City when it was announced in the news papers that the Western Federation was concerned in the murder and that it was their custom to take up all matters where the name of the Federation was involved.

John F. Nugent, another of the attorneys representing Haywood, and was at the time of Orchard's arrest practicing in Silver City, Idaho, and he was consulted by the secretary of the local union who received Haywood's message. It is known that Miller visited Orchard after his arrest and that he went to Denver to consult with the Western Federation, afterward calling on Orchard at the penitentiary at Boise. At this time Miller bought Orchard a suit of clothes, and was acting for him. While Miller was there Orchard's confession was secured by Detective McParland and when this confession came out later Miller's visits ceased.

About a score of witnesses who will be called in rebuttal by the state have arrived in Boise. They come chiefly from North Idaho, and Colorado. The defense having set up the claim of a counter conspiracy on the part of the

mineowners' association, the Citizens Alliance and the Pinkerton agency, in furtherance of which they have shown by their witnesses that the calling out of the military in Colorado was unnecessary, the state proposes to show that before the military was called out a number of terrible outrages had been committed and that lives and property of many citizens having been placed in jeopardy during the struggle between the Federation and the Mine Owners, the calling out of the military was unnecessary as a precaution.

Among the witnesses in rebuttal will be Captain McParland, the manager of the Western division of the Pinkerton National Detective Agency. It is expected that his testimony will be highly interesting and the cross examination by the defense will be searching. McParland has been the object of continual attack on the part of the defense. He has been retained by the State of Idaho ever since the arrest of Orchard and has been continually at work on the case against Moyer, Haywood and Pettibone since they were brought to Idaho.

It is probable the remainder of the week will be taken up in the examination of Moyer and Haywood. The former goes on the stand today. Counsel for the defense say his examination will not be lengthy and that he will probably be dismissed before the adjournment.

Ever since this case against Haywood began, there has been some possibility of a confession from Moyer. From the best possible information it was very likely to be made.

The statement has been made that society women of Boise are interesting themselves in an effort to ask Mrs. Moyer to secure a confession from her husband. For such reports there is not the slightest information. It is beyond question that Mrs. Moyer or Moyer himself have not been approached by any persons in Boise with a view to influencing the case. A statement to the effect is authorized by the counsel for both sides and by Moyer and his wife.

THIEVES AT WORK.

DUBLIN, July 10.—Another theft in Dublin Castle is reported. Jewelry valued at \$7500 belonging to the custodian of the crown jewels, Sir Arthur Vicars was taken it is stated at the same time the jewels of the Order of St. Patrick valued at \$250,000 were stolen. Thus far there was no clue to the thieves.
