MOYER IS ON STAND

Not Likely to be Under Examation Long

HAS MADE GOOD IMPRESSION

Prosecution Thinks He Has Made Sufficient Admission To Show Their Claim Of Intimacy Between Haywood and Orchard.

BOISE, July 11 .- Charles H. Moyer, the prisoner, president of the Western Federation of Miners, takes the stand again this morning for cross examination by the State in the Haywood trial. It is not likely that this feature of the case will occupy much time, counsel for the prosecution stating that their examination will be brief. Mover has told a straight story and the impression he created was favorable in the extreme. The position of the prosecution, however, is that Moyer has made admissions sufficient to show that their claim of intimacy between Haywood and Orchard is well founded. They point to the statement by Moyer that Simpkins, a member of the executive board of the Orchard's outward threats against Steunenberg, who had visited Orchard while the murderer was in Caldwell on his mission of assassination, and who is shown to have been there only a dew weeks before the murder, was in Spokane at the time the murder was committed, and sent a telegram to Haywood with reference to securing counsel for Orchard. This has been shown by Moyer's evidence and also that Fred Miller, according to Moyer, went to Denver after the preliminary hearing of Orehard's case at Caldwell, and while in Denver with a transcript of the evidence, was retained by Moyer and Haywood to defend Orehard, getting \$1500 as a fee and for expenses.

It is probable that Fred Miller will go on the stand after Moyer, but the defense may again pass him until after Haywood has been examined. Haywood's indirect and cross-examination may take the remainder of the week, though it is now within the bounds of possibility that the defense will close by Friday

It is rumored this morning that the repudiated confession of Steve Adams will be brought out in the course of the rebuttal, counsel of both sides are noncommittal with regard to Adams and the defense declines to say positively that they will not put him on the stand. Should they do so, counsel for the state expect to be able to produce the confession and another rumor is that Adams has withdrawn his repudiation of certain portions of the confession and that he will permit a part of it to stand.

The original of the alleged confession is in the hands of counsel for the state. It is said to contain much sensational matters and should it be brought out, it is believed the criminal record achieved by Orchard will in certain respects be eclipsed by the story Adams is said to have told and then withdrawn as un-
