CHICAGO, July 18.-King Oscar is anxious ot secure the return to Sweden of the hundreds of thousands of Swedes who have emigrated to America, and has begun an investigation to determine what were the conditions which prompted his people to leave the Fatherland and what would be necessary for Sweden to do to induce them to return. The editors of the Swedish newspapers and Swedish ministers in Chicago yesterday received from the "Emigration investigation committee" of Stockholm, a circular calling on them to ascertain from each or as many as possible of their Swedish-American readers and parishioners the chief causes of his emigration from Sweden.


